Class II: Water, not an Infinite Resource

An arrangement of fresh and/or dried plant material displayed in a watering can, size not to exceed one gallon.

Class III: Future Gardeners

Children’s class. An arrangement of fresh flowers created in a pint sized berry basket.

Class IV: Open Space- a Challenge

## 2. HORTICULTURE SHOW

Home Grown Bounty from the Land

Class I: Dahlias

1 cut stem with leaves, not to exceed 18” in length, from end of stem to tip- displayed in a clear glass bottle

**Class II: Hydrangeas**

1 cut stem, not to exceed 24 inches in length- displayed in a clear glass bottle

**Class III: Herbs**

A collection of 3 or more species of cut herbs, in a clear glass vase

**Class IV: Gourds**

A collection of 3 different species of gourds

**Class VI: Apples**

Three of the same variety or cultivar, shown on an 8 inch paper plate

**Class VII: Indian Corn**

A Collection of 3 tied together

- a) miniature
- b) standard

**Class VIII: Potatoes**

A collection of 3 of the same variety, or cultivar, displayed on an 8" paper plate

**Class IX: Sunflowers**

A cut head of a dried sunflower

**Class X: Hay**

A tied slice of hay, labeled with the variety and address where grown

**Rules for exhibitors:**

An entry fee of \$5.00 is required for each division. Material in all Arrangement entries to be identified with common plant names, botanical if possible. Horticultural cut entries to be shown in clean, label-free, clear glass bottles, or vases where specified. Paper plates will be provided for fruit and vegetable displays. Entries to be identified with common names, botanical if possible, and name of variety or cultivar. Please specify if your exhibit has been grown with or without pesticides. Entries may be brought between 2-4 p.m., Friday, October 12, 2012, and will be judged later that afternoon. All entries to be left in place until 4 p.m. Saturday, October 13, 2012.
